	<p>Warm up: https://mathsstarters.net/activity/numdaystudent/junior/5digit https://mathsstarters.net/activity/numdaystudent/junior/6digit For a more challenging number of the day check out this version - https://mathsstarters.net/activity/numdaystudent/regular/5digit</p> <p>REMEMBER THE EQUAL SIGN IN A BALANCED NUMBER SENTENCE MEANS 'THE SAME AS' - THAT IS WHAT IS ONE ONE SIDE EQUALS OR IS THE SAME AS THE OTHER SIDE. TO FIND A MISSING NUMBER YOU MUST DO THE SAME TO EACH SIDE. A SIMPLE EXAMPLE:</p> $13 + \underline{\quad} = 16 + 4$ <p>You can see in this example that to find $\underline{\quad}$ (the missing number) I have found the total of the known side of the number sentence – $16+4 = 20$ and have then minused 13 from each side to find the value of $\underline{\quad}$</p> $13 + \underline{\quad} = 20$ $- 13 \quad -13$ $\underline{\quad} = 7$ <p>Independent Activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 'Equivalent Number Sentences Level 1' OR if you are confident with balancing equations involving addition and subtraction try 'Equivalent Number Sentences Level 2' to balance number sentences involving addition, subtraction and multiplication.
